I believe that time is the best medicine to help us heal from our losses. By praying



at the memorial service, you were able to convey your gratitude to those you lost.

On Saturday, everyone enjoyed the bon odori, eating the delicious food, and shopping - members and non-members of Mantokuji, Nikkei people and those of various origins, local people and tourists. It was a very peaceful and warm scene as everyone danced together to the rhythm of the taiko drums and music.

I was selling omamori with my friends at the Hondo. I was very impressed to see so many people lined up to offer incense and greet the statue of the Buddha. Even though the Hondo is not open to the public except for Buddhist memorial services, people seemed to be interested in Buddhism and Soto Zen Buddhism and asked me many questions. I was very happy that obon drew many people to the temple to learn about Buddhism and participate in this important Buddhist tradition.

We prepared for months in advance for this two-day Obon festival. Many people helped in many ways and we are sincerely grateful to them. It was a joy to meet new people who came to help this year and it is always fun to work with those who help us every year with obon preparation.

Our Bon Festival was a great success again this year. As usual, the line for those who wanted to buy food was very long. I was surprised that the line was almost

to the street. I hope next year will be the same or better.

Mantokuji's Obon service was held on the evening of Friday, July 11th. Relatives and friends of our Hatsubon families along with sangha members filled the hondo. They were surrounded by the many lanterns hung with Memorial Ribbons dedicated to deceased loved ones. Those memorial ribbons were blessed and then burned as part of a new yearly tradition.

Reverend Hirasawa conducted the service. This is an excerpt of his sermon:

"At this service we will offer flowers, food, sutras, and incense to pray for all spirits. It is believed that during this Obon season, the spirits of our ancestors and those of our loved ones who have departed from us will return to us. Let us offer prayers of gratitude to our ancestors and loved ones and give them a warm welcome. Especially the first Obon after our loved ones have departed from us is call Hatsubon. Because this is the first time they are coming back to visit, we make sure they find their way and not get lost.

We are standing at the tail end of our ancestors. If one of them were missing, we would not be here today. Life is fleeting and our existence is indispensable. We should be grateful to be alive, to breathe, and to feel the warmth of our hearts. We sometimes tend to take many things for granted. However, we must know how much our lives today are based on good fortune. During the Obon season, we who live in the present world must keep this in mind once again."

On Saturday, July 12th, Mantokuji's O-Bon Festival began with the energetic performance of Zenshin Daiko under the clear sky. It's very heartwarming to watch the children play their hearts out and entertain the crowd. Then Maui Taiko WOWED the spectators with their performance! Our heartfelt THANK YOUs to both dedicated groups.

Reverend Hirasawa then performed a Blessing Service to begin the Bon dancing. People anxiously waited and filled the dance ring to capacity! The legendary *Tanko Bushi* began the night of dancing.
