Interview with Authors Hatsuko and Ryuhei Ogawa

Hatsuko and Ryuhei Ogawa from Suzuka City in Mie, Japan have authored guidebooks for Japanese travelers interested in the religious lives and culture of the modern Japanese diaspora living in Hawaii. They have published the books: "Temple Tour on the Island of Aloha – Maukamakai Narrow Road (Hawaii Island)" and "We are Kauaians". The Ogawas have visited and written about Buddhist temples on the Big Island and Kauai, and now they are working on a book about Maui. On November 21, the Ogawa's interviewed Rev. A New Year's Blessing Service will be held on January 12, 2025 at 10:00am. Reverend Hirasawa will perform "Daihannya Tendoku." Instead of reading the sutras page by page, he flips through the Daihannya book and prays for each attendee's happiness and rids their hearts of suffering. O-Fuda will be passed out to each family.

The O-fuda Yaki service, the burning of sacred objects, will be conducted following the Blessing Service. Please bring your old omamori, o-fuda, and other burnable altar objects to the temple before January 12 or on the morning of the service. Please remove all metal and plastic before putting the items to be burned in the container labeled "For O-fuda Yaki Service" on the office lanai.

Omamori will be sold after the New Year's Blessing Service in the social hall. The cost is \$5 each. See the omamori available on the right.
